s with its predecessors, the Greek editions of Ancient Greek Comedies In Brief and Ancient Greek Tragedies In Brief, this book is not necessarily intended to be read from cover to cover. Although it constitutes a fascinating collection of stories, it can also be used as a reference for those readers who want to become familiar with the details of a play.

Rather than reading a play in its entirety, this book also offers a convenient alternative to those wishing to obtain a better knowledge of the plot before attending a production. The clear and detailed descriptions will allow the reader to follow and enjoy a play even if performed in a foreign language.

Whilst by no means a replacement of the original texts, *Ancient Greek Drama In Brief* provides an accessible introduction to these works which are of fundamental importance to Western literature.
